Horses & Winter Colic

Colic is a clinical sign of pain in horses caused when the abdominal wall stretches, putting pressure on the horse's sensitive nerve endings. Common symptoms of colic are restlessness, change of behavior after feeding, lack of interest in food and a reoccurring desire to roll or lay down. Colic, if not caught early, can be fatal. During winter months colic cases are far from uncommon. The main cause of winter colic is dehydration. If symptoms persist contact your veterinarian. You can prevent dehydration by making sure your horse has access to clean, fresh water. Agway carries a variety of heated buckets and stock tank heaters along with Legends and Triple Crown feeds to keep your horses healthy and happy.

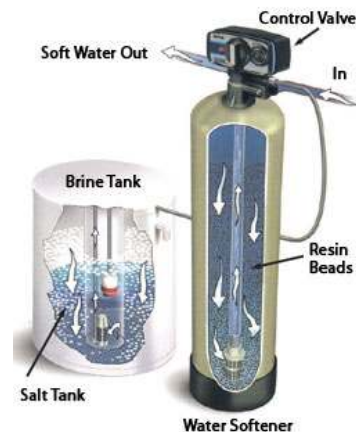
Aquarium Installation and Maintenance

How Does a Water Softener Work?

To wash off hard water minerals from the resin, brine water is injected into the softener. Hard water fills the tank. As it passes through the resin, the hard water ions are attracted to the resin. By the time the water gets to the bottom of the tank it is soft.
